Programme :Programme means an educational programme leading to Award of Bachler of Education. 2 year Degree. The Bachelor of Education Degree duration of two years Programme, generally Known as B.Ed. is a training course that prepare teachers for middle level (Classes VI-VIII),Secondary (classes IX - X) and Senior secondary classes (XI-XII).

- (a) **Semester** Each Semester will consist of 17-18 weeks of academic work equivalent to 100 actual teaching days. Exclusive in the period of Examination & Evaluation
- (b) Academic Years- The duration of the course shall cover a period of two academic yeardivided into four semesters.
- (c) **Course**: A course may be designed to comprise lectures,tutorials,outreach activities assignments POT (Internship)
- (d) Credit: A credit is unit by which the course work is measured. One credit =15 instructional hours and 30 hours of practical work It determines the number of hours at interaction per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecture) or two hours of practical per weak.
- (e) **CGPA**: It is a measure of overall performance in semesters. The CGPA is the ratio of total Grade points secured by a student in various course in all semesters and sum of the total credits of all course in all the semester. It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10 point scale.
- (f) Letter Grade: it is in the index of the performance of students in a said course.
  - (g) Semester Grade point Average:-It is a measure of performance of work, done in a semester.

**External examiner-** Who belong to this university and also from any other university.

Internal examiner- The internal examiner is the teacher who teaches the subject regularly through out the year.  $\square$

## 5. The Course and the Duration

The Duration of B.Ed.Programme shall be of a duration of two academic years, which can be completed in amaximum of three years from date of registration to the programme.

## 6. Eligibility for Admission

- Candidate with at least 50% (45% in case of SC/ST/OBC/PWD & other reserved categories) either Bachelor's Degree and / or in Master's Degree in Science/Social Science/ Humanities/Commerce, Bachelor's in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and mathematics with 55% (50% in case of SC/ST/OBC/PWD & other reserved categories) marks or any other qualification equivalent thereto, are eligible for consideration in admission to B.Ed. course.
- For admission the Candidate shall have to choose only one of the teaching subject (within a subject category) which she/he must have studied in the qualifying degree, i.e., Bachelor's Degree or Master's Degree for at least 200 marks and obtained at least 50% in the subject. The subject will henceforth be referred to as the teaching subject in the B.Ed. course.
- The Reservation of seats shall be as per the rule of Jharkhand Government.

## 7. Admission Procedure

Admission shall be made on the merit basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination or any other selection process as per the policy at the Jharkhand government.

## 8. Working Days

Attendance provision for End Term Semester Examination.

- (a) There shall be at least 200 (Two hundred) working days each year exclusive of the period of examination & admission.
- (b) The minimum attendance of student-teachers shall have to be 80% for all course work and practicum, and 90% for school Internship.

## 9. Registration

Any students who has not registered with respective university shall have to get himself/ herself registered with that of university on payment of the requisite fee as defined by the university. The students who are not registered under respective university shall not be allowed to appear in the examination.

### 10. Examination

- A. To be permitted to appear in the examination for the degree of B.Ed. (Bachelor of Education)
  - Must have completed the course of study prescribed for B.Ed.programme.
  - Must have completed the course in maximum of three years from the date of Registration to the programme.
- B. Candidate for Bachelor of Degree shall be examined in nineteen (19) papers carrying total 1400 marks.(When second pedagogy will be included )
  - i. There should be four courses carrying 100 marks each (80 marks for theory and 20 marks for internal assessments).
  - ii. There shall be eleven (11) papers carrying 50 marks each (40 marks theory and 10 marks for internal assessment).
  - iii. There shall be four EPC (Enhancing Professional Capacity) papers carrying 50 marks each which will be evaluated by Concerned Teacher.
  - iv. There shall be two pedagogy subject carrying 50 marks in each for External evaluation.
  - v. The concerned teacher of the course/paper shall be responsible for conducting the one/ two mid semester test (as the case may be) and other components of the continuous internal assessment and shall also be evaluated by the concerned teacher. The time (3 hours/ 1hour 30minutes) of written examination will be conducted on basis of credit hours of concerned paper.
  - vi. After completion of the half of syllabus of each semester 1<sup>st</sup> internal assessment will be conducted and 2<sup>nd</sup> internal assessment will be conducted after the completion the syllabus i.e. means two internal examination will be conducted and the final marks will be the average marks of two internal assessment.
  - vii. There will be two External Examiner for assessment of two pedagogy subject who must have minimum three years teaching experience as teacher educator
  - viii. The end semester examination will be conducted by the university and the syllabus for each 6 credit paper shall be divided into 6 units and 3 credit paper Shall be divided into 3 units Based on this the question paper in the end semester examination shall be as follows:-

Moderation will be arranged by the examination Board for accuracy and quality of question paper.

## 14. Conduct of Examination and moderation of Result

The examination shall be conducted by the respective university. The university shall finalize the program me for the examination and will charge the approved examination fee to conduct the examination.

## 15. Promotion Criteria

- i. To pass a theory paper the student must secure separately at least 40 % marks in internal assessment and 40 % in external examination of that paper. Where as in practical papers the student have to secure 50% marks to pass in the practical paper.
- ii. No student will be detain in odd semesters (I & III)
- iii. To get promotion from semesters II & III student will we required to pass in eight(8) out of the eleven (11) -papers Sem I & Sem II taken together.
- iv. Those students who have 80 % of attendance of Regular class & 90% in internship program will be allowed to give End Semester Examination.
- v. Candidates shall have to clear their backlog paper in the next End Semester Examination of that semester as applicable. There shall be no supplementary examination in any of the semester course (I, II, III & IV)
- vi. Even if a student is promoted to Fourth semester, his/her final result will only be declared when he/she has cleared all their backlog papers.
- vii. A candidate if he/she has passed in Internal Assessment (IA) but fails in theory papers, his/her Internal marks will be retains and will appear in the theory paper only of the semester whenever available. But if a candidate is declared fail in any End Semester Examination he/she has to appear again in IA as well as theory paper. If a candidate fails in internal assessment of a particular paper the candidate will not be allowed to appear in the end semester exam of the corresponding paper.
- viii. If a student has backlog papers in any Semester and cleared the IV th semester the Result of the candidate Who has passed the IV th semester Examination but not passed the lower semester Examination shall be declared as NCL (Not completed lower semester examination.) Such candidate shall be eligible for the degree only after completion of the lower semester examination within the stipulated maximum time period but the name of such student shall not be incorporated in merit list

- B.Com/ B.B.A Graduates, M.Com/ M.B.A post Graduates may opt for teaching subjects- (Pedagogy- I) commerce and pedagogy- II as Economics (As per the subject studied at Graduation level).
- B.CA Graduate /M.CA Post Graduate may opt forpedagogy of Computer science as one subject.
- The other subjects shall be pedagogy of mathematics.
- B.E/B.Tech/ M.Tech students may opt for teaching subject (Pedagogy-I, Mathematics) and Pedagogy-II Physical science (any other studied school subject studied at Graduation level.
- B.Sc. Home science/ M.Sc.Home science- Pedagogy- I will be honors subject and Pedagogy-II will be any other subject than honors course in Graduation level.
- B.Sc. (Life Science) M.Sc. Life science- Graduates may opt for teaching subject Pedagogy- I- Biological sciences 2- Physical. Science.
- B.Sc./M.Sc. (Mathematics) The student may opt teaching subject, Pedagogy I MathematicsPedagogy 2 Physical Science.
- B.Sc./ M.Sc. (Physics)The student may opt Teaching subject, Pedagogy I Physical Science, Pedagogy 2 – Mathematics.
- B.Sc. / M.Sc. (Chemistry)The student may opt Teaching subject, Pedagogy I Physical Science, Pedagogy – II – Biological Science. A students studied other that Bio-Science from any University he/ She may take other subject which he/ She studied at Graduation level at the second – pedagogy.
- B.A./M.A. Arts Graduation may opt for any two pedagogical subjects one each from following subjects :(a) Pedagogy of Social Studies / Economics / History / Geography / Political Science (Civics).
- B.A. Hons / PG. Economics, English, Bangla, History, Political science (Civics), Geography, Hindi, Sanskrit, Urdu, Home Science students may opt their Pedagogy-I as Hons subject and Pedagogy-II as from any other subsidiary subject studied at Graduate level.
- B.A/ PG- Philosophy, Psychology, Sociology and Education student may opt Pedagogy-I as (Social science) and Pedagogy-II as any other subsidiary subject studied at Graduation level.
- The candidates shall be given the required subject combination depending upon their availability in their college / university.
- Pedagogy subjects will remain the same in all the semesters.
